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BIBLE CRUMBS | PR. DAVE

"This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God."

Luke 8:11

I have never been to AGFEST. But I will be going this year. I love the concept of young people running an event to encourage young people to consider Agriculture as a career. I think this is a great initiative because farming is the backbone of Tasmania and I would even suggest it is the backbone of Australia.

I have never been a farmer, but I appreciate the hard work that farmers do and have learned that farmers have a wealth of wisdom that they acquire from working with the land and/or animals. Farmers learn how land, and animals behave and rely heavily on the weather and natural weather patterns to successfully farm.

In a nutshell, I could never be a farmer. I don't have the smarts. But I love hanging out with them and learning things from them that I wouldn't anywhere else. The Bible often uses farming as a parable to teach spiritual lessons.

One such story is found in Luke 8. A sower sows seeds and the seeds land on three different types of soil. The first is rocky ground, the second has weeds and the third is good soil. The seed on the rocky ground gets picked up by birds, the second set of seeds sprout and grow, but they are choked out by the weeds. The third set grows and flourishes.

Jesus then explains. The seed is the word of God. The rocky ground represents those who hear the word, get excited about it but don't let the word sink in. Distractions in life soon pick at the word and these people forget. The ground with weeds represents those who hear the word, make a commitment, but then are choked out by the busyness or life. Work, school, business, relationships, finances etc. The third type of ground where there is good soil represent people who hear the word, let it sink in and live by the word.

This is an incredible parable. The lesson makes for an amazing illustration of learning patience, sunshine and water for the plants etc.

We may not all be able to be as skillful as our Tasmanian farmers. But we can all do our part by being good soil to receive the seed, and paying it forward by sowing them.
