Dear Parents and Guardians,

Last week I was able to travel to Brisbane to be a part of a leadership conference with educational leaders from all around the country. While I was travelling, I noticed a phenomenon of travellers glued to their phones with no one paying regard to other travellers. I started thinking about what we did before phones and how life was for myself as a student without a phone. (Unless you count the brick I received when I was sixteen that I used to play the game snake)

I asked myself two questions:

- 1. When is the right time to give my child a phone?
- 2. When is the right time to allow my child to use social media?

Are we putting our kids under too much pressure giving them access to phones, social media and other public forums before they are mature enough to handle these outlets?

I would hate to think of some of the silly things I might have done, had I had the same access to these public forums and devices when I was their age. Not to mention the things our children can say to each other when you don't have to say something to someone's face. What would happen if our children didn't have access to these devices or social media...?

I imagine cyber bullying would diminish. I imagine that we would see an improved focus on study. I imagine there would be better face to face interactions with each other. I imagine we would see improved state of mental well-being (is there a coincidence that mental health issues have spiked with the increase of social media/device use?). I imagine our children would be more creative with their time. I imagine there would be more book reading and better literacy, I imagine there would be better sleep patterns for students. I imagine there would be improved privacy and personal boundaries. The list could continue. NSW has banned students from bringing mobile phones to school. While we haven't banned the bringing of mobile phones to school, students are very aware that they are not allowed to use them at school without permission and they bring them to school at their own risk.

I was told a story of a child from Michigan, USA. He was able to save the whole school bus of students when the bus driver fell unconscious at the wheel. Why? I believe his dad sums it up best. Dillon's father, Steve, told CBS: "What else are you going to do when you don't have a phone? You're going to look at people, you're going to notice stuff. You're going to look out the window. It's a very powerful lesson, maybe a change-the-world kind of lesson."

SCHOOL ACCESS

You are now able to enter the school through the new reception office. Please refrain from using the side doors in the senior wing, aside from afternoon pick-up. Parents and other visitors are required to sign in on entry if accessing the school beyond usual drop-off and pick-up times.

LATE ARRIVALS & EARLY DEPARTURES

Parents/guardians are required to sign their child in/out in the reception office should they arrive late or need to leave early. Where reasonably possible, please provide a warning of late arrivals/early departures if you are aware of this in advance.

ABSENCES

Please remember to contact the office as early as possible if your child will not be in attendance for any reason. For our records, we also require a brief explanation.

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

If you make a temporary change to your child's usual travel arrangements to/from school (bus/car) please contact the office as soon as possible so staff members and bus drivers are kept informed of relevant changes.

LOST PROPERTY

We have three colourful bins labelled, Lost Property Lunchboxes and Water Bottles, Lost Property Hats and Lost Property Jackets and Jumpers which are located outside the Home Ec Room. This is where the above items will be placed if they are left lying around the school in the afternoon. So please ask your child to check the lost property bins in case their lost item is in there.
