Out of Uniform: Please send a note with your child explaining why they are out of uniform each day. Students will need to hand the note into the office and get an out of uniform sticker. Their name will be recorded. If a student is out of uniform without a note they will receive a lunchtime detention. Lunchtime detentions will start in Term 4. Please take the time between now and October 16 to make sure your child has the correct uniform. Please contact Mrs. Ellis in the office if you need support in ordering uniform items. Just a reminder that girls wear navy socks and boys wear grey socks.

Belt of Truth: The belt holds everything together. It is the foundation for everything.



WALK-A-THON FUNDRAISER

Once a year we fundraise for our two sponsored students:


☐ Robin, 13 year old boy who lives at an Asian Aid school in Bangladesh. We supply a midday meal and cover his school expenses. (\$45 per month)

☐ Laniporn, a young lady who has just graduated from High School and lives at the Kirsten Jade Rescue Centre (Adventist Rescue Children's Care). She has started university and still needs our help with schooling expenses and food. (\$50 per month)

Any fundraising money leftover after supporting our two sponsored students goes to help pay some of the postage for our Shoeboxes. They are \$12 each now – however, we are able to send what we have raised. The aim is: each student tries and collects sponsorships of \$10 or over. (remember to ask the staff, your extended families, church members, friends, neighbours – with parents' permission). Walka-thon forms will be sent home in Week 1 of Term 4. There will be prizes for the student in each class group that raises the most money.
