

PRIMARY NEWS

Values: We are focusing on the value: Excellence. The focus of Excellence is: displaying a positive attitude and giving their best on every task.

Water Bottles: Please ensure your child/ren brings a full water bottle to school daily to stay hydrated.

Packed Lunch: Please aim to send a packed lunch every day with your child that includes fruit break, recess and lunch – sandwich, wrap, sushi, etc (that doesn't need to be heated). This will allow your child to eat all their lunch in the 10 minutes allocated before they go out to play.



Out of Uniform: Please send a note with your child explaining why they are out of uniform each day they are out of uniform. Students will need to hand the note into the office and get an out-of-uniform sticker. Their name will be recorded. If a student is out of uniform without a note, they will receive a lunchtime detention. Lunchtime detentions will start in Term 4. Please take the time between now and 16th October to ensure your child/ren has the correct uniform. Please get in touch with Mrs. Ellis in the Office if you need support ordering uniforms. This is just a reminder that girls wear navy socks and boys wear grey socks. Students wear plain white socks with their sports uniform.

Starting Term 4: Boys need to tuck their shirts into their shorts or trousers, and girls need to tuck shirts into their skirts.

Jewellery/Fingernail Polish: Just a reminder that students are not allowed to wear bracelets, necklaces and rings to school. Earrings should be one pair of small, round studs (ear piercing size and not spikey), one in each ear. Only clear nail polish is to be worn, and no make-up should be worn.

Stationery Stocktake: Please check with your child if they are in need of any of the following items restocked in their pencil case: lead pencils, glue, erasers, coloured pencils, textas and scissors. Please purchase the items and label your child's names on them, and send the items to school.

Any fundraising money leftover after supporting our two sponsored students goes to help pay some of the postage for our Shoeboxes. They are \$12 each now – however, we are able to send what we have raised. The aim is: each Student tries and collects sponsorships of \$10 or over. (remember to ask the staff, your extended families, church members, friends, neighbours – with parents' permission). Walk-a-thon forms will be sent home in Week 1 of Term 4. There will be prizes for the student in each class group that raises the most money.
