Broken Bone

"But where sin abounded, grace abounded much more." (Romans 5:20)

When a baby is born it is composed of around 270 bones at birth. The total amount of bones decreases to 206 by adulthood after some bones get fused together.

A broken bone is called a fracture. A fracture is when a break goes through part, or all of a bone. Have you ever broken a bone? Maybe you have broken your finger, wrist, arm, leg, neck, or back bone. It always hurts to break a bone. Most broken bones are treated with a cast, splint, or brace. Sometimes a person may need pins. Ouch! It can take weeks for a bone to heal.

In the first few days after a fracture, the body forms a blood clot around the broken bone to protect it and deliver the cells needed for healing. Then, an area of healing tissue forms around the broken bone. This is called a callus. It joins the broken bones together. It's soft at first, then gets harder and stronger over the following week.

It has been said for example that once a bone in your arm has broken in an area, there is a bulge once the bone is healed. The probability of the bone breaking in that spot again is very unlikely. This can be illustrated with sin. Sin has broken us and this world. But one day Jesus will make a new heaven and a new earth and all things will be restored. Our relationship with God will be stronger than ever before. One person said, "The universe will be better off after sin than if sin had never risen." We would have never learned the meaning of the word "grace" had we not sinned.




